Discussion Questions

- 1.) The sermon emphasizes the beauty of God's dwelling place. How do you personally experience God's presence in your life?
- 2.) Reflect on the story of the sons of Korah. How does their redemption story encourage you in your own faith journey?
- 3.) PZ mentions the "valley of weeping" that we sometimes encounter. Can you share a time when you felt stuck in a difficult season? How did God help you through it?
- 4.) How can we cultivate a greater hunger for God's presence in our daily lives?
- 5.) The sermon states, "A single day in your courts is better than a thousand anywhere else." What does this mean to you practically?
- 6.) Discuss the importance of corporate worship. How has being part of a church community impacted your faith?
- 7.) PZ emphasizes not staying in our brokenness. How can we encourage each other to keep moving forward in our faith, even when it's difficult?

- 6.) Practice gratitude by listing three ways you've experienced God's presence in the past week.
- 7.) Consider volunteering at your church or in your community as a way of being a "gatekeeper in the house of God."
