## DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. In light of the recent trials our community has faced, how can we find hope in the promise of Romans 8:28, which assures us that God causes everything to work together for the good of those who love Him?
2. Reflecting on the sermon, how does the act of questioning God's plan, much like the prophet Habakkuk did, serve to strengthen our faith rather than weaken it?
3. Considering the personal struggles and setbacks mentioned in the sermon, how can we apply Philippians 1:6 in our lives to remain confident in God's ongoing work within us?
4. The sermon touched on the importance of being honest with God about our doubts and fears. What are some practical ways we can express our doubts to God while still maintaining a posture of trust, as seen in Psalm 77?
5. How can we draw strength from the story of Habakkuk when we are faced with circumstances that challenge our understanding of God's justice and goodness?
6. As discussed in the sermon, humor and personal anecdotes can be a source of encouragement in our spiritual journey. Share a personal story that helped you see God's hand at work during a difficult time.
7. The sermon encouraged us to trust in God's timing and His ultimate victory, as highlighted in Habakkuk 2. How can this assurance comfort us when we face delays or unanswered prayers?
8. Reflecting on Romans 8:26, how does the Holy Spirit intercede for us in times when we find it difficult to pray? Share a time when you experienced the Spirit's intercession in your own life.
9. The sermon mentioned the importance of community support during hard times. How can we, as a church family, practically support one another when someone is facing trials?
10. In light of the sermon, how can we reconcile the concept of God being both a loving Father and a just Judge, especially when we observe evil and suffering in the world?
